Parish Council green and open spaces report April 2025

The Parish Council own and care for several sites within the Parish boundary, we undertake to care and improve these green spaces.

The MUGA Area (Multi Use Games Area) in Salisbury Avenue is one of the largest areas of responsibility. During this last year much, work has been undertaken to improve and regenerate this area.

The Toddlers play area has had new benches and repairs to equipment also work on the shrubbery to give an open aspect for parents to watch over their children.

The MUGA area adjoining is for the older children and in constant use for football etc. The Parish Council has just approved a 30K upgrade to give alternative equipment use for those who do not use the football area.

The ongoing problem within this area is litter! It is being addressed by monthly litter picks and trying to encourage the users to help.

There is a small play space in The Lanes called The Spindles, this is maintained by CBC but we have supported it with funding for small equipment and improvements.

We have a small green space in Gwernant Road where we have planted a tree and spreading some wildflower seeds.

There is also an area off Leckhampton road Undercliff Avenue, there are 8 trees also planted a bench and notice board.

Leckhampton War Memorial, which has 3 trees on it. The Council are looking at options to clean and improve the area.

Other spaces used but not owned in our Parish are;

- Weavers Field recently had a newly planted orchard
- Lotts Meadow
- And Burrows playing Field where we have given considerably towards sports areas, new pathways, and shortly providing a weather cover for the snack bar .

Last but not least is the Brizen recreational Field off the Up Hatherley Way. This is in our Parish but maintained by CBC. We have a lovely row of apple trees along the boundary which are all in bloom at the moment!

There is equipment on site for toddlers at the far end of the field and a MUGA and twin fly for the older children adjacent to the Brizen centre Hall.
